

Norton Tricentennial Park: PHASE TWO

Since our initial request for donations in March, 2011, we have had an outstanding response and received many generous and strategic donations. These are some of the donations so far: five 6-foot park benches, the arbor for the entrance to the park, the park sign, a farm hydrant, crushed bluestone for the park pathway, many hours of design work and labor, and much more. We believe that PHASE ONE - the design, cleanup, pathway and overall organization - will be completed by early August.
