You will be given an opportunity to see a photo or sketch of an item you wish to donate prior to its purchase and installation.

| 1. Landscape design services | 2. Small grass play area to serve as an outdoor "living room" |
| 3. Dedicated or memorial benches – probably 6 benches made from recycled material; final number will depend on final design. | 4. Pathway materials of finely-crushed bluestone (or alternative) suitable for wheelchair/stroller access |
| 5. A natural stone water feature with surrounding vegetation | 6. Four to six small sectional gardens with native vegetation |
| 7. An arbor made from recycled plastic or other material | 8. Native vines for the arbor to provide shade and to attract wildlife such as hummingbirds |
| 9. Native Wildflowers in order to attract birds and butterflies | 10. Native trees for shade and for nesting sites as well as shelter and food for wildlife |
| 11. Native Shrubs to provide flowers and berries for wildlife as well as shelter to raise young | 12. Engraved granite rock at entrance of park with surrounding vegetation |
| 13. A sign of quality recycled material for West Main St. that indicates the entrance to: a. Norton Tricentennial Park b. Children’s Playground and c. Historic Campbell House | 14. General park fund donation of any amount. Every dollar will help us to make this park a source of pride for our town of Norton. |
