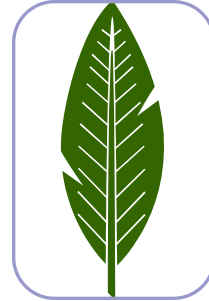
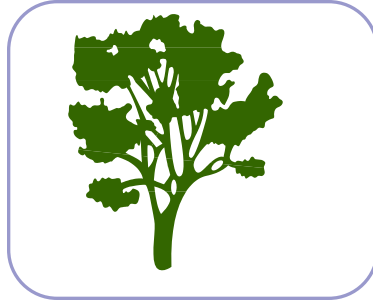


TRICENTENNIAL PARK

GROUNDBREAKING

FRIDAY, APRIL 29TH 1:00-1:30PM



The Norton Tricentennial Park will become a permanent memorial to the town's 300th birthday. It is located at 223 West Main St. in front of the Norton Middle School & the Community Playground and adjacent to the historic Campbell House.

We look forward to sharing our vision:

A vine-covered arbor will serve as the entrance to the park. Along the pathway, we plan to display a variety of attractive native plants, ground covers and shrubs. We will include an innovative natural water feature, small grassy area, dedicated gardens and memorial benches. (Several benches and other kinds of support have already been offered.)

We believe this park will be a fitting permanent memorial to the Tricentennial of our town and a lovely outdoor space celebrating Norton's

Past - by helping to preserve native plants and animals and enhancing the historic Campbell House on the property;

Present - by applying environmentally sensible design and technologically current solutions to outdoor space development; and

Future - by providing an opportunity for Norton school children to perform meaningful public service projects and to learn about Norton's nature and history first-hand - through workshops and other learning activities.
